Q - What is your fondest memory about NSB?

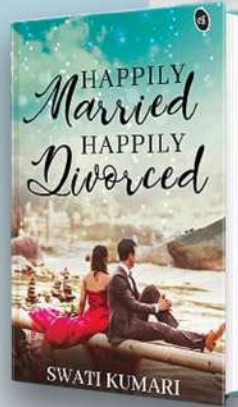
A - It is difficult to tell a specific moment, but it was the golden period of my life. I met the best people; the best teachers and the 2 years have taught me a lot.

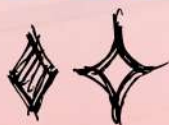

Types of Mutual Funds

-Sharath Kumar

Equity funds: The funds that are invested in stock or shares of companies. Equity funds are high in risk and return.

Debt Funds: These funds are invested in government bonds, debentures and fixed income assets. They give fixed returns and considered as safe investments.

Hybrid funds: These funds are invested in diversified asset classes. In hybrid funds risk and return are proportionate and perfectly balanced.

Sector Funds: these funds are invested in particular sector exclusively ex; infrastructure, real estate etc. Returns are directly proportionate to performance of that sector.

Index Funds: These are the funds invested by representing specific index in order to monitor the movement of change in the index e.g.: Nifty NSE

Tax Saving Funds: Tax saving funds are eligible to claim deductions under income tax act. These funds are mostly invested in equity shares.

Growth Funds: Growth funds are usually long-term funds invested in equity stocks as an objective of capital appreciation.

Liquid Funds: Liquid funds are majorly invested in short term instruments like CP's, T-bills etc. with the sole purpose of providing liquidity. They provide moderate reruns on investment.

TEAM WORK LESSON FROM GEESE BIRD

Recently, on an evening I and my friend were riding a bike in cloudy weather and suddenly I found that a group of geese are flocking in the sky in V- shaped pattern.

Slowly I started thinking about how these Geese birds are flying in a V-shaped pattern and understood that nature has its own way of teaching us management lessons.

Fact-1: As each Goose flaps its wings it creates an “uplift” for the birds that follow. By flying in a “**V**” **shape** formation, the whole flock adds 71% greater flying range than bird flying alone.

Lesson: People in an organisation share their work among themselves to plan their project in quicker and easier way and where they are co-ordinated by trust among each other.

Fact-2: When the lead Goose is tired, it rotates back into the formation and another Goose flies to the point position.

Lesson: In this scenario, it teaches us, where people are sharing their skills and capabilities among each other during the hard tasks.

Fact-3: The Geese flying in formation, honks to encourage the up front to keep up their speed.

Lesson: In groups where there is encouragement, the production is much greater. The power of encouragement is the quality of honking.

Fact-4: When a Goose gets sick, wounded or shot down, two Geese drop out of formation and follow it down to help and protect it. They stay with it until it dies or is able to fly again.

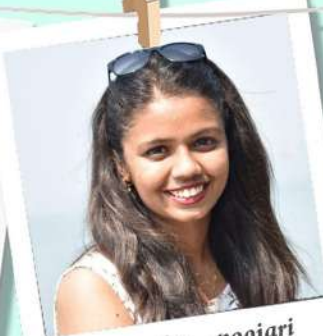
